

Western Local Health District

The Western NSW Local Health District provides services for a diverse population of more than 260,000, mostly concentrated in cities and towns, with some living in remote areas. The district sees growing investment in health care programmes and capital works projects and has a primary focus on community engagement.





Orange is the largest urban area in the Central West region of NSW the centre of a heritage area close to many historic villages and famous for its Autumn colours. The region is a food hub, surrounded by wineries, with regular farmers markets, a food week and a wine week showcasing local produce. Orange food week was named as one of the 100 Greatest Australian Gourmet Experiences by Australian Traveller Magazine in 2010. There are around 21 primary and secondary schools in the area.
